


## Junior Sports Day—Tuesday 19th July, 1.30pm at <u>SJB</u>

#### **Feedback**

We value your feedback , whether it is through questionnaires, Governor coffee and chat or other forms of communication in school. We appreciate it when you tell us what you think we are doing well and we reflect on anything you suggest we could improve. Here are a few things you have discussed with us(more to follow):

#### Homework

In order to communicate more effectively on homework this year, we organised introductory meetings with class teachers at the beginning of the year. Homework is an area in which parent/carers have different opinions. Some parents feel there should be more whilst others less. In order to address this and ensure homework most effectively supports children's learning at SJB we reviewed our policy and made the following decisions. Each year group will have age-related weekly homework which links directly to basic skills. This is compulsory and essential homework including regular reading, maths learn its and Big Talk homework. However, optional homework is also set through the year, particularly in KS2, encompassing the wider curriculum. This is often project based, requiring problem solving and allowing for greater creativity. We made provision for a homework club but there was very little demand. Please let your child's current class teacher know if this is something your child would be interested in in September.

#### Communication

You asked that we try to give you more notice about events in school. We have tried this year to make sure any pre-booked events are on the newsletter calendar and where possible give you increased notice of assemblies and other events. We will continue to work on this and hope you have seen an improvement. Sometimes we are informed of events last minute. We will often still seek to run with these events where possible as we like to take every opportunity given to us.
