S

SAFE: Keep yourself safe by not giving out any personal information when you post online. Personal information includes your name, address or phone number.

M

MEETING: Meeting somebody you have spoken to online can be very dangerous. Online friends are still strangers, If anybody asks to meet you, tell an adult straight away.

A

ACCEPTING: Accepting files and friend requests from people you don't know can lead to problems. They may contain viruses or nasty messages. If you receive a request from an unknown person, tell an adult.

R

RELIABLE: Someone online may lie about who they are. Information on the internet is not always true. Always check information with other sources.

T

TELL: Tell your parent, carer or trusted grown up if someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried.
