Content

- SJB Long Term Plan outlines the Geography topics in each year group.
- A consistent approach to teaching Geography through using the Unity Curriculum Modules.

- Geography is taught in modules throughout KS1 and KS2 building upon clearly stated previous knowledge.
- EYFS experiences prepare children for Geography in Key Stage 1.



Teaching Key Points

- Each lesson starts with a question.
- Key vocabulary is shared at the start of a lesson.
- A map relevant to unit is displayed in the classroom to refer to.
- Knowledge map is displayed in children's books for each unit.
- Children use lesson knowledge notes to support their learning.
- Teachers make revisits to previous learning.
- Children record their work in Geography books.



Teaching

- Geography is taught in modules throughout the year (see Sequence of Learning plans).
- Supporting field trips are arranged to support and extend modules.
- Inspirational visitors are encouraged.



Formative Assessment

- Children are assessed at the end of each lesson based on the lesson question.
- Unity quizzes support ongoing teacher assessment.
- Unity quizzes can also be used at the end of a unit.
- Retrieval practise is built into lessons to assess understanding.
